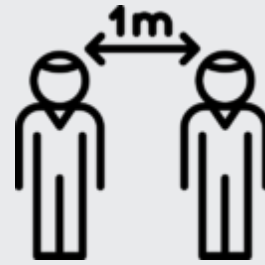
Communication with athletes, self-care and risk minimization.



- Direct communication will be maintained with athletes and athletes and those involved in the event to ensure ensure that all are in good health. in good health.
- Participation will be prohibited if you are ill or potentially or potentially exposed to an infectious agent.
- We have a responsibility to protect everyone involved. everyone involved.

Control Measures in Competition

- Reinforcing intrapersonal detachment throughout the event
- Registration and packet delivery events will be will be extended and fractionalized.
- All competition packets will be disinfected and disinfected and sealed prior to delivery.
- The technical briefing will be held virtually the days prior to the event.
- All information will be available in digital format. digital format.



Hygiene



- Hand sanitizer, hand wash, and disinfectant wipes will be available disinfectant wipes will be available at our will be available at our career sites to enhance the cleanliness of common areas of the venue.
- Staff and volunteers will be provided with masks, mouth covers and gloves to wear while working in all athlete-facing areas.
- Athletes will be provided with face shields at the package reception area and athletes will be encouraged to wear a facial cover around our event venues.



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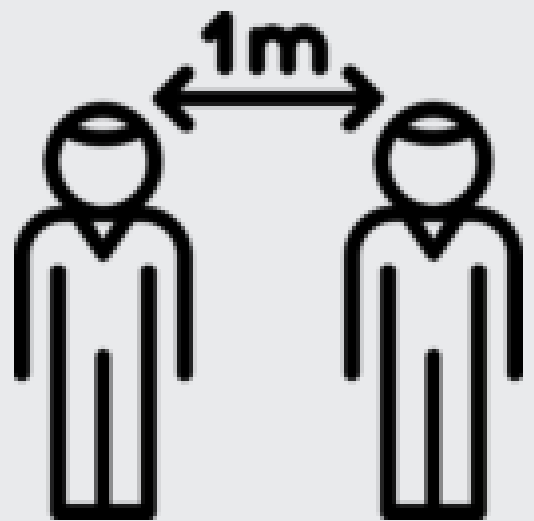
Detection and education

- Education and training will be provided on personal health, personal hygiene, and safe support for staff and support for staff and volunteers in the necessary functional areas needed.
- Athletes and volunteers will be required to complete a pre-race health questionnaire. In addition, in many locations, body temperature non-contact body temperature contact. According to World Health Organization World Health Organization guidelines, people with a body temperature of more than 100.4° Fahrenheit or 38° Celsius will not be able to compete, volunteer or work.



Density reduction

- Our teams are implementing measures to increase space for athletes and support staff in areas such as swim start, transition, and finish.
- We are making appropriate modifications or eliminating non-essential race services such as banquets, in-person race briefings, etc.



Traffic and Points of contact

- Touchpoints and points of interaction between staff, participants, and teams will be reduced or eliminated in many aspects of the event.
- We have redesigned areas such as athlete check-in, spectator area, transition area and finish line to minimize person-to-person contact.
- Aid stations will be reconfigured to minimize contact between athletes and volunteers.
